





DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The most important part about Theatre, to me, is the ability to transform. I want to come to the theater and experience a story that serves as a reflection of my own experiences. I want to leave the theater with numerous questions. I want to be certain throughout the story I'm witnessing, and at the same time, eagerly await that new bit of information that brings about doubt. This is why we do what we do. We seek transformation.

Doubt, A Parable, by John Patrick Shanley is the perfect example. He set it in 1964, a time when change was rampant. The Civil Rights Act was signed into law, John F. Kennedy was assassinated, and we had a new president. Race riots were exploding across the US, and the Catholic Church was going through significant change due to the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council or "Vatican II." CHANGE. In the middle of all of this is the most important character of the play: Donald Muller. A young African-American boy who is the first student of color at Saint Nicholas Catholic School. The student that every conversation is about.

For the next hour and a half, I invite you to allow yourself to experience the continuum between certainty and doubt. The humility it takes to be certain, and the courage it takes to doubt.



JOHN PATRICK SHANLEY is from the Bronx. He was thrown out of St. Helena's kindergarten. He was banned from St. Anthony's hot lunch program for life. He was expelled from Cardinal Spellman High School. He was placed on academic probation by New York University and instructed to appear before a tribunal if he wished to return. When asked why he had been treated in this way by all these institutions, he burst into tears and said he had no idea. Then he went into the United States Marine Corps. He did fine. He's still doing okay.

Tom Makar (Sound Designer)




