

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
# **JANUARY 17, 18 & 19 ONLY!**

Winner of the King's Cross New Writing Award in London, this is a grotesque black comedy of treachery, revenge, literature... and onions.

In this charming satire from the repertoire of the Abbey Theatre, the lives of the guirky inhabitants of a sleepy seaside village in Ireland, circa 1930, are plunged into chaos with the arrival of a traveling theatre troupe intent upon enriching their lives with the heady works of Ibsen, Strindberg and Chekov. Astoundingly, the plays are hits, playing to sold out houses. The theatre troupe is elated. However, in the meantime, the steady stream of unrelentingly melodramatic fare has had a traumatic effect on the impressionable Inishers.
